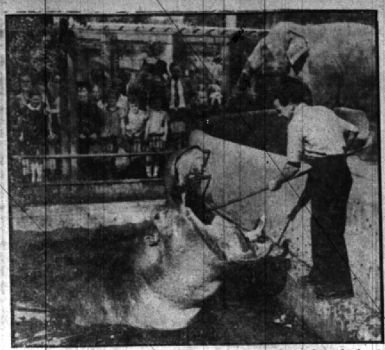
Farwell Luncheon

About 200 members and their families attended.

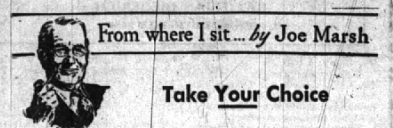

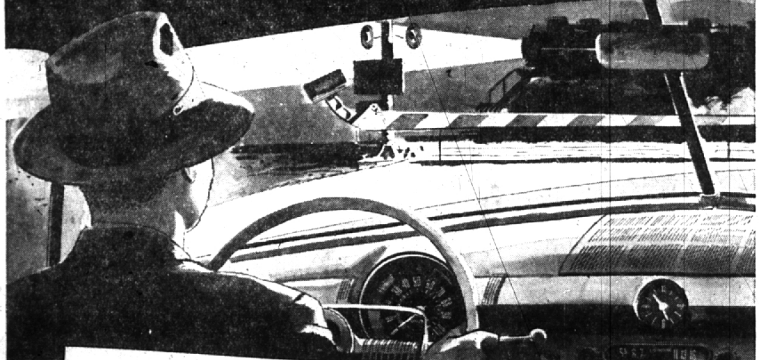
