Fall 10 Stories, Crash at 60 MPH, Results Are Same

"If, at 60 miles an hour you crash your car into an immovable object, you have the same chances of walking away as an egg does of remaining uncracked after being hit full force by a tennis racket."

That is the statement of Police Chief Ralph W. Moxley as he explains the reason for the current speed control program in the city and state.

"Roughly speaking," he said, the effect of hitting a solid obstruction at 60 miles an hour is equivalent to driving your car off the roof of a ten-story building. The damage to car and occupants can be expected to be about the same in either case.

"AT 60 MILES AN HOUR," Chief Moxley pointed out, "the occupant of the car, is injured, is eight times more likely to die of those injuries than those he would receive at 20 miles an hour, one third the speed factor."

Chief Moxley made these statements locally as a part of the state safety commission's program to emphasize this month to motorists the terrific energy and destructive power that is inherent in a speeding car.

Moxley again stressed the greater possibilities of an accident at high speed. Stopping distance is greater, the car travels much farther before the driver can put his awareness of the need for stopping into actual physical action.

"Just as an example, while you take one short breath at 70 miles an hour, you travel 100 feet!" he emphasized.

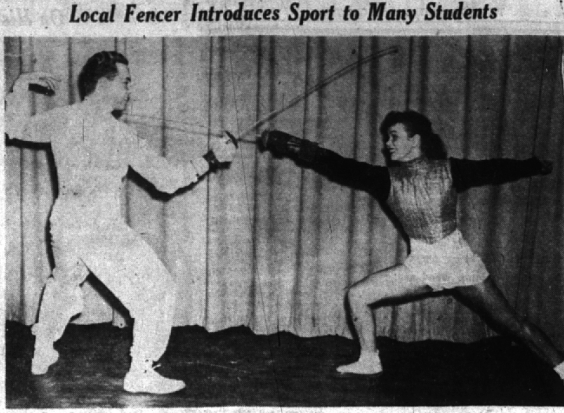

Former Birmingham Teacher To Speak At Paris Conference

Miss Frieda Huggett of Pontiac, a former Birmingham high school teacher, is one of 12 persons from the United States who will speak at the International conference on social work to be held in Paris later this month.

One of a party of 50 flying from New York July 8, Miss Huggett will speak on and present for discussion the topic, "Some Present Day American Social Problems."

Miss Huggett has been a visiting teacher in the Waterford school system for the past three years.

She is also active in the field of juvenile delinquency prevention.

In 1946, Grimm won the state novice sabre championship at the Salle de l'Escuyer club in Detroit. At that time he was said to be the youngest fencer in state competition in Michigan.

He uses all three weapons, foil, sabre and epee and is a member of the Michigan division of the Amateur fencers' league of America.
