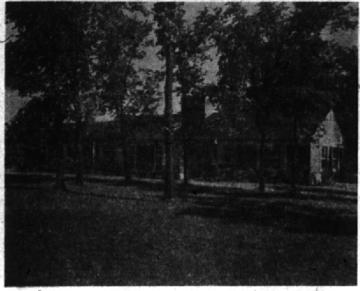

"Now that my company has me working in Detroit and I only spend my evenings at home, I suppose I'm qualified to be a Birmingham city commissioner," a local resident remarked to this Wanderer. We won't agree or disagree with the gentleman but will merely state that of the present seven commissioners, only one both works and lives in Birmingham.

Mayor Bruce G. Booth appeals to local residents to take up their problems with the city manager BEFORE they approach the city commission for a solution or for relief. "Our meetings now are getting so long that we have hardly enough time to get our regular business accomplished, business that has to be done," the Mayor explained. 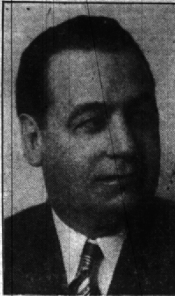

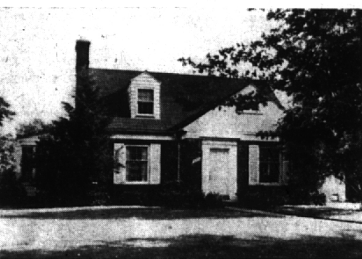

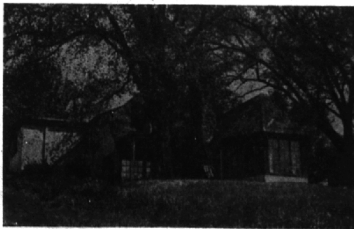
