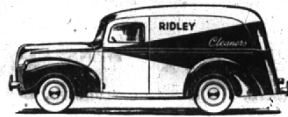


Raus' Great Dane, Rippledale's Blue Bonnet, Wins Honors

Road Committee at Walnut Lake Reports Progress

WALNUT LAKE—Members of the road committee report they are still working to complete necessary petitions for blacktopping of Inkster and Walnut Lake roads. It was reported several weeks ago that if an understanding can be reached with three of the larger property owners in the area, the assessment can be spread and work started. The Knollwood golf course has agreed to pay \$1,000 for paving part of the road east of the course. The estimated cost was about \$1,500 for their frontage.

AS IT NOW stands, their endorsement of the petition will be made if other local property owners will agree to underwrite the difference, to be reimbursed later through popular subscription. Knollwood's position in the matter is that their members do not use Inkster road, but they stand ready to donate the \$1,000 to aid the committee.

Howard Flint, another large property owner said he will pay his assessment if he may arrange to have Quaton road, from Inkster to his driveway, surfaced at the same time. He also agreed to pay this additional cost. Thompson-Brown, the third property owner whose signature is needed for the success of the petitions, have agreed to pay if they may have a guaranteed maximum estimate of the cost before signing.

BY ANOTHER METHOD, the Thompson-Brown signature could be had through an agreement that they be permitted to withdraw if the cost went beyond a certain stated figure, after all bids were in and examined.

There has been some question in the minds of Bloomfield officials as to the accuracy of the estimated cost of \$35,000. They believe it may be low. Furthermore, they say they are not ready to estimate assessments until they are sure of the cost of the project. Most of the assessment area lies in West Bloomfield township.
