Laurette Young, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. N. R. Young of 21900 Midway, Southfield township, is rapidly establishing herself as one of the state's finest women archers.

The 15-year-old girl, shooting with senior women for the first time, won first place at the opening meet of the Michigan Archer's association at Jackson May 18.

Again at Jackson last September, Laurette copped the junior girls state championship. For her efforts, she received the Frank L. Brown gold cup award.

She was also awarded first place junior medal at the MAA meet in Saginaw last August.

The Southfield township girl started target archery in 1948 as a Girl scout. That year she won the scout arrow for first place.

Last year she also won the Southfield Girl scout day camp archery tournament and was awarded the scout trophy for Class A junior American round.

She is coached by her father, who shoots in the Class B division of the Archer's association.

Blaine Eynon, Pat Sawyer Come from Behind to Win Pine Lake Invitational

With the match even, the Eynon-Sawyer team scrambled to a win on the extra hole when their opponents three-putted after hitting the par-tee hole in two.

ORCHARD LAKE PUBLIC FISHING SITE—RULES AND REGULATIONS
Located in the Village of Orchard Lake, Oakland County

(Issued under authority of Act 17, Public Acts of 1921, as amended.)

- To occupy this site without having a license issued to the bearer. Children 15 years of age and under not accompanied by adults.
- To use this site for picnicking or other purposes.
- To anchor or leave boats unattended on the water.
- To use the toilets on the site except at designated places, or to urinate on the ground.
- To use this site for picnicking or other purposes.
- To remove or change clothing within the site.
- To build open fires on the site.
- To use the site for the disposal of rubbish, refuse, or garbage on the ground.
- To remove or injure trees, shrubs, plants, or other vegetation, or to remove, break, or injure any building, equipment, improvement, sign, or other public property.
- To use the site for any other purpose.
- To enter or occupy this site during certain hours of each day as may be determined by the Director of Conservation and Parks.
- These rules and regulations shall be in force and effect from June 25, 1950, to June 20, 1951.
