

### Adult Conference at Christ Church Will Begin Sunday

Nearly 300 members of the Episcopal Diocese of Michigan are expected to attend the annual Cranbrook school June 18-22. The conference, which will offer classes of instruction in the meaning of Christian life, is to deepen the fellowship of the members of the church.

The Right Rev. Richard S. Emrich, bishop of the diocese, will be among the instructors for the various courses. Dr. F. W. Dillstone, professor of theology at the Episcopal Theological school and Miss Maude Cutler, director of the department of women at the Philadelphia Divinity school, specialist in Christian education, will also instruct groups.

A school of music will offer organists, choir masters and choir members instructions in music in the church. Dr. Maurice Garabrant, organist and choir director at Christ Church Cranbrook, George Hunsche, of St. Andrew's church, Detroit, will have charge.

The conference will open Sunday evening at 8 o'clock.

Carillon and organ recitals are planned for each evening of the

conference. Following the carillon recital Wednesday evening there will be a festival service of choral evensong.

Others participating are: Mrs. Charles E. Dengler of Jackson has been a director of arrangements. Dr. Maurice Garabrant, carillonist; the Rev. Gibson Winters of Parishfield; the Rev. L. Clark Attridge, D.D., Detroit and Miss Margery Culey, director of Christian education in the diocese.
