

400 Feet of Curb To Be Replaced in B'ham Estates Area

Torry Sidewalk Found Necessary

Replacement of 400 to 500 feet of curb in the Birmingham estates subdivision will be accomplished in connection with that area's street surfacing program this summer, City Manager Donald C. Egbert said.

Necessity for \$2,000 worth of sidewalk construction on Torry was determined by the city commission Monday night and sent to the city assessor for preparation of the assessment roll. Sixty-two property owners have petitioned for the improvement on the east side of the street between Holland and Lincoln. The commission enlarged the project to include a walk on both sides of the street.
