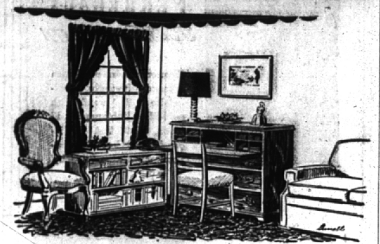


**United in Marriage at Home Ceremony**
