Among the 470 students participating in this summer's experiment in International Living trips to Europe, Mexico, Columbia, Israel and India are three persons from Birmingham.

In August, each experimenter invites his student host to accompany his group of ten Americans, five men and five women and a leader in cycling, camping, or working, so he has an opportunity to see the country in which he is living.

To become an experimenter the student must have a satisfactory general academic record, leadership qualities, participation in extra-curricular activities, special interest in hobbies, at least two years' study of the language to be spoken and experience in simple outdoor living.
