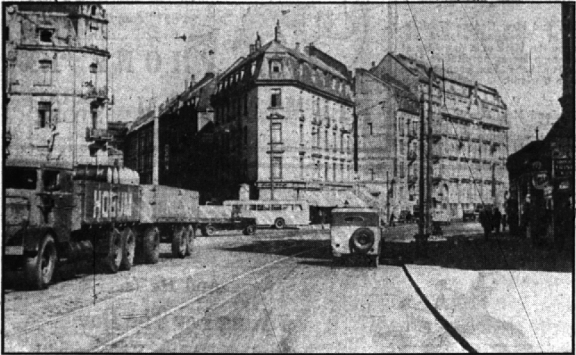


D-DAY PLUS SIX YEARS

Six years have passed since American troops stormed the Normandy beaches. The successive campaigns through France, Belgium, Holland and Germany will long be remembered, but time already has erased many of the scars of war. The wartime picture, at right, of Fifth Army infantrymen advancing cautiously through the rubble-littered streets of Frankfurt, Germany, contrasts strongly with the picture below, which shows the same scene today. The peaceful atmosphere in which civilians move quietly about their business is a far cry from the constant rumbling of artillery six years ago. And the clean streets and patched-up buildings bear few traces of the wreckage of the world's costliest war.

It starts today and continues through Sunday with six flights of golfers in action each day.

Many of the Detroit district's finest players are entered in the tournament and many fine golfers from out-state and out of the state are also entered.

Qualifying will be completed by Thursday evening and all flights will be determined and begin play on Friday morning. Selective drives will be played and after the tee shot alternate shots will be played by the two-man teams. It will be the only invitational tournament to be played in this manner around the district this year.

A STAG DINNER for all contestants will be given this evening, after which the sweepstakes drawing will take place. On Saturday evening a dinner dance for all contestants and club members has been planned. Prizes will be presented Sunday afternoon.

According to Jack Inkster, golf professional at Pine Lake, some of the contestants in the tournament will be Tom Draper, Michigan amateur champion; Ben Smith, Detroit district champion from Lechmoor; Ed Flowers, former Michigan amateur champion, Tom Sheehan of Oakland Hills, former Detroit district champion and Dick Whiting of Red Run, former member of the Notre Dame varsity and former junior district champion.

Pat Sawyer, former professional at Birmingham Country Club and now a resident of Minnesota, is an entry of special interest to local golf fans. He is playing with Blaine Eynon of Birmingham and is at present the state amateur champion of Minnesota.

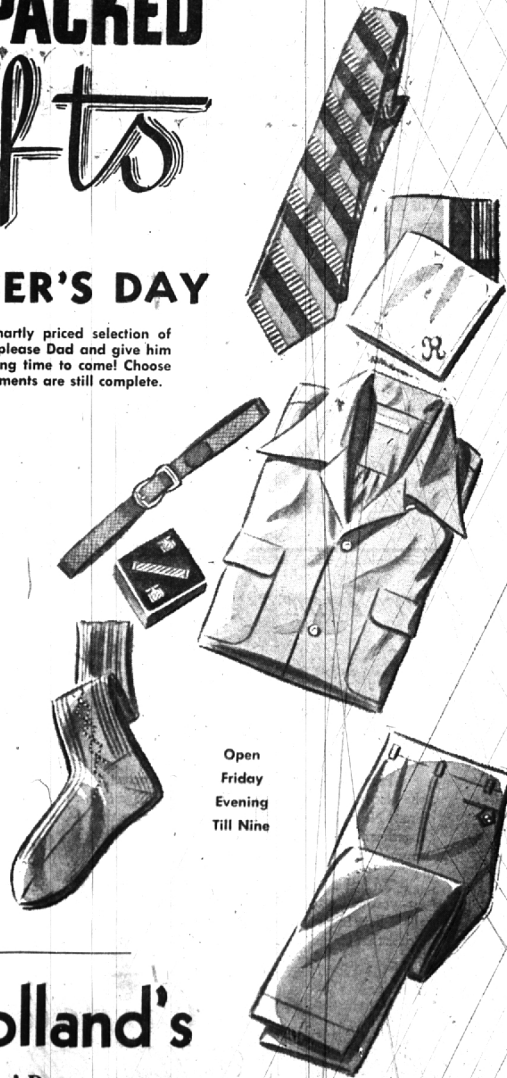
