MAC" BOOTH

Today at an all-school assembly, Mac Booth, a January Baldwin graduate, will receive the Johnson memorial award. It will be presented by Larry Johnson, son of Coach George F. Johnson, in whose memory the plaque was established.
Generally considered the highest honor conferred by the school, the award goes annually to the "best student-athlete", with athletic ability and scholarship counting equally.
Booth was valedictorian of his class, carrying a high average for his four years' work. He is a member of the National Honor Society and served as its president.
Enviably Record
As an athlete he holds an enviable record. Though six-foot-two and weighing only 145 pounds, he was rated the best end in the Eastern Michigan league and received all-state mention on Detroit newspapers' teams. He usually played every minute of every game and was equally good on offense or defense.
On the 1940 state championship track team, Booth was a star high hurdler, placing third in this event at the state meet with 16.6. He was a member of the record-holding shuttle hurdle relay team of the Central Michigan relay club. He also broadjumped, and as a junior he was a good pole vaulter.
He has been very popular, serving three years in Student Congress, one term as vice president; president of the Assembly club; holder of various class offices and one of six students elected to "Who's Who".

Adams Cubs Planning Visit to Sportsman's Show at State Fair
Cub scouts of Pack B-8, Adams school, plus parents and friends—160 strong — will attend the Sportsman's show at the Detroit Coliseum April 1, sitting in a specially reserved block of seats arranged with the Detroit sportsman's congress sponsors of the show.
Cub scouts in dens which collected the most waste paper in last November's drive will be awarded free tickets to the show, plus "treats." The den chiefs (scouts who work with the pack) and den mothers have also been presented tickets by the pack committee.
Combining the most modern methods with ancient Indian ceremonies, the Pack held an advertisement ceremony at Adams school last week in which 37 cub scouts were awarded Indian feathers and emblems of rank for their achievements.
The pack's 14-foot Indian totem pole and its "smoking" council fire, as well as the auditorium's public address system, were used in the ceremonial.
