"True, there never was a time when greater need for economy in government is needed than today. The question is—what is real economy? I do not believe it should mean that we cut down in our efforts to support those democratic nations in western Europe which are the only ones we can build up to hold off the spread of Communism in these areas of the earth."

"If Congress too suddenly removes our support of non-Communist areas, then the dike will open up, and the waters of Communism will inundate nations that still need our help. It would be like taking away an engine from a sick man who as yet can't freely get his breath."

Crazy Fiscal Policy
"One reason why we have such a high federal budget is because Congress, when launching on a big project, appropriates the entire cost in many cases, in one year. Successful industry doesn't do this—why should government not operate likewise?"

"If a government project is to cost a hundred millions of dollars or more, it should be spread over five years, why not appropriate only 20 millions annually, instead of the whole hundred million?"

"If Congress were to follow the financing pattern of successful in-

dustry, its budget would not be so large today . . . and then the lesser, but most necessary costs of aiding other nations to rehabilitate themselves and thus join in our fight against Communism would not be cut down so mercilessly—so politically," continued Moody.

"Following a business pattern in domestic spending would enable the government to render needed services to the people in other directions."

Freedom's Enemies
Speaking of influence antagonistic to the perpetuation of the American way of life, the speaker said: "I am convinced, after years of observation of law-making in Washington, that our greatest enemies of freedom are not the 'leftists' and the 'rightists' but rather those extreme 'rightists' who, for selfish interests alone, oppose the lowering of tariff barriers on a world-wide basis."

"These are Stalin's best friends in America. They oppose the only way that other nations can acquire eventual increases in their living standards—and this increase is the best, realistic argument against the way of the Communist life."

"The United States will have to make sacrifices—as I've stated before—sacrifices that will enable other nations to have their goods and currencies flow over the entire earth."

No Immediate War
Moody doesn't expect Soviet

Russia to embark upon a war with us in the immediate future. "I do not fear that the Kremlin will decide to drop bombs upon this nation right away," he said. "Russia, I believe, willing to wait from three to five years, hoping that during that time we shall have a depression, that we and other democracies will blow up Russia would then expect hunger to become her ally for conquest."

"If we don't blow us, then the Kremlin will have to decide whether or not to launch a war against us. She will make up her mind on the basis of cold calculations."

"The next few months are most important ones—for what Congress does to carry on this 'cold war', both at home and abroad, will determine whether or not we have peace or war," concluded Moody.

Contact Congressmen
He urged that all Americans let their Congressmen know how they feel on the issues of the day. Moody also argued for a more careful selection, by the voters, of the men and women they elect to represent them in all units of government.

Appraises Tito
Having traveled extensively in Europe during and since the last war, Moody gave his audience a brief appraisal of Marshal Tito, head of Yugoslavia. He said Tito, while a Communist and follower of Karl Marx, believes Communism can be achieved and held on a national basis, outside the centralized influence and direction of Moscow.

"To be sure, we are giving Tito

some aid in his fight against Stalin, and I believe this to be all right—for Tito is the only pro-Communist leader in Europe today who has the courage to stand up against the Kremlin," went on Moody.

"Tito believes in the Marxian doctrine, while Stalin operates on a different ideology. Tito is holding back the spread of Soviet influence and for that reason alone I feel we should help him. Since the last war Russia has conquered more people than any nation ever did—and she did it without openly engaging in war."

"The next few months are most important ones—for what Congress does to carry on this 'cold war', both at home and abroad, will determine whether or not we have peace or war," concluded Moody.

Approves 'Point Four'
Regarding President Truman's "Point Four", which suggests that American capital and brains should be invested in backward nations to aid them in raising their standards of living and thus fight off Communism, Moody was in substantial agreement.

"But we must be very careful not to be labeled as 'economic imperialists'. We must be sure that the nations we desire to help will know that our efforts are to help them—not to the exclusion of American investors, but certainly avoiding the economic

tion of 'exploitation'. Moody emphasized.

"This 'cold war' we are now engaged in may be long, expensive, grueling and demanding of many sacrifices—but however long it may be, it will be less costly in money and human lives, than a third world war."

The speaker was introduced by Mrs. Stanley Cain, first vice-president of the Birmingham League of Women Voters.

Prior to Moody's talk, Mrs. Alan Mitchell, member of the League's national board, talked briefly, praising the League's membership increase throughout Michigan. She said that on her current tour of the State, she had found local League groups have

expanded to provide a better cross-section of the populace in their memberships.
