In the picture above, Jim is learning the very difficult control of the muscles in his arms and legs. The reciprocal skills which Jimmy is standing on were a gift of the Birmingham alumnae to the clinic. They are designed so that the left foot and right arm operate together and vice versa, as in normal walking.

Alpha Chi Omega has also contributed a metal wheel chair especially built for nursery school children. The chairman of the committee which presented this gift was Mrs. Heideman who has opened her home for benefit bridge parties for the past two years to aid this cause.

Speech training is also an important part of the clinic's program and because the nursery has learned that the chances of teaching a patient to walk in many cerebral palsy cases is much greater if the person can begin to learn very young, they are taking children at much earlier ages than before.
