

Chevie Quintet Goes into Finals in YMCA League Competition

Defeated in their first encounter with Craig's sporting goods store, the North Chevrolet quintet jumped back from the loser's bracket in the two loss and out-play-off series to eliminate Craig's last Monday night, at Barnum school by a 24-20 score.

The game was closely contested with a total of 35 fouls called.

North Chevrolet sank 14 of 22 attempts and Craig's managed to drop 10 of their 17 tries.

In the first quarter, both quintets played a man-to-man shifting zone defense and used a fast break to advance the ball down the floor. Don Little, of the Red, White and Blue outfit, sank two dog shots to give North Chevrolet a 7 to 5 quarter lead.

Both teams matched each other

on baskets in the second quarter to bring the half to a close 15 to 12, in favor of North Chevrolet.

Led by John McDonald and Harold Kelley, North Chevrolet played cautious basketball in the third quarter to retain possession of the ball and forged ahead by a 28 to 19 count. In this quarter, they made four of their 14 shots for the basket, and dropped in six out of six foul shots.

The last quarter saw Craig's make a determined effort to tie the score but the final whistle found them trailing after they outscored North Chevrolet 11 to 10 points in the last few minutes of play.

The loss eliminated Craig's sporting goods from further play and put North Chevrolet in the finals against W. A. Caltrider. These two quintets will meet for the play-off trophy.

In a preliminary game, W. A. Caltrider defeated Fred's Barber Shop, 34 to 25. Fred's "Clippers" were the winners of the consolation trophy and had challenged the leaders to a return game.

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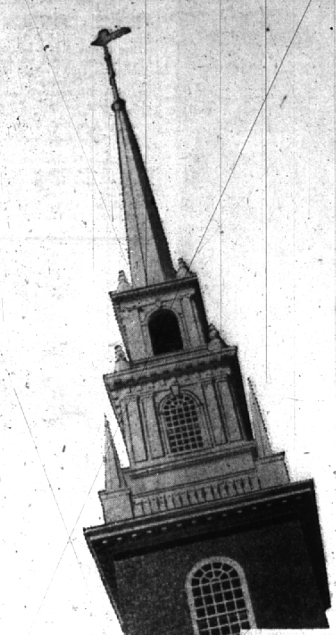
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
