

### British Girl is Adopted by PEO

PEO chapter AK of which Mrs. Frederick A. Froehner of Hanna street is group secretary, has "adopted" Shirley Harriman, seven-year-old British girl, through the Foster Parents' Plan for War Children. It has been announced by Mrs. Edna Bibe, international chairman.
