Section 33. ALLOWANCE OF REGULAR INTEREST. The Board may regulate the interest on any assets credited to the annuity savings fund, annuity reserve fund, and the pension reserve fund.

Section 34. ASSIGNMENTS PROHIBITED. The right of a person to an annuity, pension, retirement allowance, or the return of accumulated contributions, the annuity, the pension, or the retirement allowance itself, any option or other right accruing or accruing to any member or beneficiary under the provisions of this chapter, and the moneys belonging to the Retirement System, shall be assignable and shall vest in the member or beneficiary.

Section 35. ERRORS. Should any change or error in the records result in any member or beneficiary receiving more or less than he would have been entitled to receive had the records been correct, the Board shall correct such error and make as practical adjustments.

Section 36. OTHER PROVISIONS OF CHARTER OR ORDINANCE. No other provision of law, charter, or ordinance which provides wholly or partly at the expense of the City for pensions or retirement benefits for employees shall apply to members or beneficiaries of the Retirement System.

Section 37. SOCIAL SECURITY PROVISION. Should the employees of the City be required by law now or hereafter enacted, to contribute to the Social Security Act, the Board may modify the benefits provided by this Retirement System.

Section 38. VALIDITY. If any provision, section, paragraph, sentence, clause or word in this charter is held to be unconstitutional, the remainder of the provisions of this charter shall nevertheless continue in full force and effect.

CHARTER AMENDMENT NUMBER TWO—ASSESSMENT ROLL

Section 1 of Chapter IX of the Charter of the City of Birmingham BE AMENDED TO PROVIDE FOR THE PREPARATION OF AN ASSESSMENT ROLL TO THE FIRST MONDAY IN MARCH IN EACH YEAR.
