Attorney General Asked to Clarify License Procedure

SOUTHFIELD—Attorney General Stephen Roth has been requested by State Police Commissioner Donald S. Leonard for an opinion on whether the commissioner or sheriff may authorize municipal examiners to handle driver's license applications for rural residents.
The decision will affect Southfield township residents who now must apply for driver's licenses at the sheriff's office in Pontiac. Several weeks ago D. P. Frame, township supervisor, asked Leonard whether the law can be changed so residents may apply for licenses at municipalities closer than Pontiac.
Leonard recently stated, "This situation is the result of the inadvertent omission in a 1945 amendment to the driver license law of a provision which permitted rural residents to apply for a driver's license at any examining station located within five miles of his residence."
THE SHERIFF is generally authorized to act for the commissioner for drivers' license examinations for rural residents. Applications, therefore, from persons residing outside villages and cities maintaining licensing bureaus are processed by the sheriff.

"We have requested the Attorney General for an opinion as to whether the commissioner of the sheriff may authorize municipal examiners to process driver license applications for rural residents."
"In his opinion is favorable, arrangements may then be made with local authorities by the sheriff to handle applications for residents in contiguous territory."
