Birmingham City Manager Donald C. Egbert emphasizes: "This is extremely important to the City of Birmingham, in that it is estimated that approximately \$10,000 returns to the city for each individual in the City. This return is made on a population basis.

"Birmingham suffers a substantial loss in that a large percentage of our population is counted with college towns, where students are attending college and living in other cities.

"The City of Birmingham should, therefore, have the benefit of having each individual citizen counted, in order to secure the proper return from the distribution of such taxes as the intangible, sales, and gas and weight taxes."
