Bits of Birmingham

Birmingham's unregistered citizenry are no respecters of periods. Last week City Commissioner John O'Gorman was annoyed by "someone" who was tipping over the garbage can. The culprit has been detected although to date not apprehended. O'Gorman made the identification known to police when his dog trod a large racoon at the rear of his home.

A rather interesting sidelight on the traffic situation in Birmingham is shown in a glance through the daily record book at police headquarters. During the first 10 days of this month there were 137 arrests for moving violations. While in the majority of cases some of these drivers were involved in accidents, each case represented "accident material." There is no way of knowing how many accidents are prevented by patrolling our city streets, but it stands to reason that the rate would be far greater if motorists were left to their own inclination. Bear in mind, while reading this, that these figures do not represent tickets for parking, obstructing traffic by improper use of an automobile or any similar situation. They are improper turns, running signals, speeding, cutting traffic and the like—all seeds that may sprout into full-grown accidents.

Reports on the Nuremberg war crimes trials will be included in the program of the International Bar Association conference to be held July 19-26 in London, England. DeWitt N. Travis, 1927 Forest, a former prosecutor at the trials, has been invited to become a patron and prepare a paper for the conference. Travis said he plans to attend the London meeting.

The pipe raiting on the south-east corner of Maple and Southfield is scheduled for early re-pairing. City Commissioner Ralph A. Main brought it to the attention of city officials as a "potentially dangerous condition." The raiting was recently knocked down by a woman driver who told police her brakes failed as she approached that corner.

A dead or partially dead tree can still perform a useful service, Edward Kvet, Jr., 778 Kvet road, reminded the city commission. The commission approved the removal of the tree. It is the older part of town. One of the trees was a 20-inch willow at the corner of Greenwood and Oak. Kvet said he didn't care whether or not the tree was taken down, but he pointed out the tree, if left might permit a careless motorist to wind up against the trunk rather than shoot across the front lawn and land against their house.

David Sewell, who lives on Randall pike, is seeking a home for several pigeons. David began raising pigeons a few years ago and now finds himself with more than he had room for. The birds have been well cared for and David is anxious to find good homes for them. Any young boys in Birmingham may contact him for further information. Reinhart will speak at the ceremony which will be a part of the nation-wide observation, honoring the several military services.

Miss Farrell spoke of the operation and development of statistical material to improve the service these groups offer to individual clients. Other speakers included Mrs. Barbara Hill Watt, consultant for the children's division of the Oakland county branch, state department of social welfare, Hubert Earle, home service supervisor for the county and Mrs. Edna Thillingstad, registrar of the Flint exchange. They outlined the manner in which the exchange can help the various agencies work more closely and more efficiently together when more than one is concerned in the case of a family or individual.
