Omans Report Shows Building Here Past Last Year's Totals

The April building report just released by Barkley Omans, city building inspector, although below the March figures, shows a sharp gain over the corresponding month for 1949.

The 89 permits issued call for buildings totaling \$919,125, as compared to \$125,604 last year and \$1,028,772 for March, 1950.

There are 55 single residents included, representing \$612,500; one elementary school, \$212,000; one lumber mill, \$30,000; 19 private garages, \$12,956; alterations on five homes, \$3,920; alterations, furniture store, \$27,000; alterations, business establishment, \$750.

Permits were also issued to move structures, razing and renews.

The total for 1950 is \$2,569,227, as compared to \$1,504,737 for the previous year.

City Gives Property for 16 Mile Opening

City commissioners Monday night agreed to convey to Oakland county the southerly 42 feet of a lot in Bloomfield estates subdivision to be used in the right-of-way for the proposed opening of 16 Mile road from Adams to Woodward.

At the suggestion of Commissioner Ralph A. Main, the commission also will permit the county to take an additional 42 feet of the lot if the southern half of the right-of-way at this point cannot be acquired at a reasonable price from the private property owner.

Scavarda will tell of the many state police activities and of the extensive work they are doing toward greater highway safety.

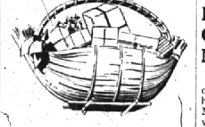
4 Local Students Plan Push Cart Race at MSC Saturday

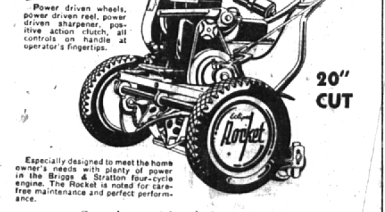

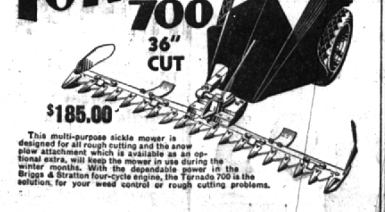
