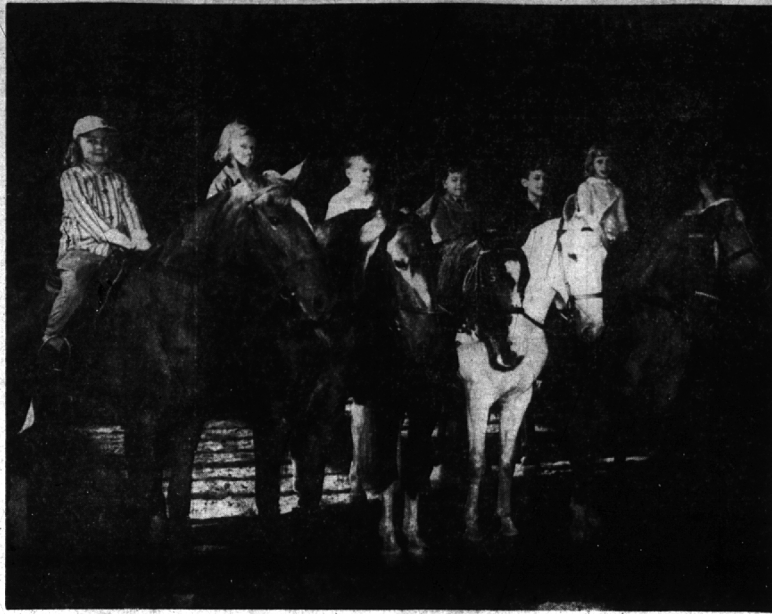


Youngsters to Participate in Horsemanship Show Saturday

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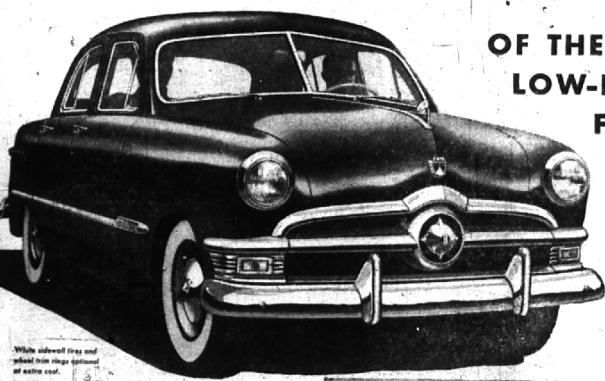

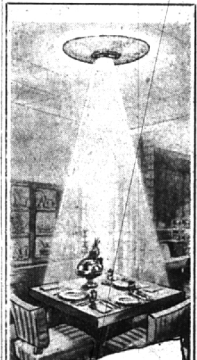
**Present Day Club Elects Officers**
