This represents the amount considered necessary to repair the present sewer system and block off manholes draining fields and other vacant areas. To date the assessment has brought in \$5,500, all of which has been spent.

**FINDINGS SHOW** the continuation of the 11 Mile truck drain, from Santa Barbara to Southfield, is vital to final drainage correction. It would do away with two automatic pumps now needed because of a difference in the level of two sewer lines.

The cost of this extension has been estimated at \$34,000. The recent flood conditions have aided in hastening requests for this and the necessary petitions have been handed the commissioner.

The association is also lending its support to the effort of a safer crossing for school children. It has been decided to have them cross at a point north of the bicycle racks. The association is building a sidewalk at this point and erecting special crossing signs.
