William H. Hessler will be the principal speaker at this annual spring reunion and will address the group on "Our International Challenge at Mid-Century". Hessler is editorial writer and foreign news analyst for the Cincinnati Enquirer and has been since 1930. He broadcasts on station WLW each Sunday on "The World Front" and also weekly on "Voice of the Enquirer".

He served three years in the United States Navy during World War II and now is a Lt. Commander in the Naval Reserve. His service included military government and also public relations work. While on duty in the Pacific he served on the aircraft carriers Enterprise, Lexington and Independence and on the battleship Washington. His combat service included the Luzon, Iwo Jima and Okinawa operations.

In the Navy and since, Hessler has written, extensively, for naval journals. He received awards three times for articles on naval strategy and his articles are used in the Naval War College.

He has had letters of commendation from Admirals E. J. King and C. W. Nimitz for his writings. He resigned his commission in 1949 and is the author of "Operation Survival", published in October, 1949.

Hessler was formerly in the diplomatic service as vice-consul at Bombay, India. In 1941 he made an extended journey through South America to study political problems and in 1946 went to Bikini Atoll, in the Marshall Islands, to report the atomic bomb test. Educated at Ohio Wesleyan
