

Federal Fiscal Policy To Be Discussed By Economist at LWV Open Meeting

How can LWV help to stop inflation? This question will be answered by George P. Hitchings, manager of the economic analysis department of the Ford Motor company, who will speak at the League of Women Voters at 1:30 p. m., Monday, November 20, at the Community House on the subject of "our national economy and the federal fiscal policy that will keep it most stable and expanding."

This program is open to all men and women who want a factual presentation of this large problem. The program will be preceded by a business meeting at 1 p. m.

THE PRO'S AND CON'S of the effects of using the various federal fiscal and monetary measures on the economy will be presented by the speaker.

In the opinion of the League's economic committee, headed by Mrs. Harry Markle, Mrs. Hitchings comes well qualified by education and business experience to his assignment.

Hitchings came to the Ford Motor company in 1947 from the Federal Reserve bank of New York, where he had been economist from 1929. Prior to this position he was economic assistant of the Federal Reserve board for two years.

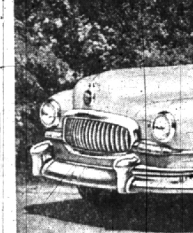

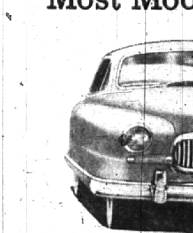

Quarton PTA Reveals Book Program Plans

Since the founding of the school library two years ago, Quarton school PTA reports it has spent \$1,375 for books, not including the money allotted the school by the board of education.

The library now has 2,205 books, including those on hand when the program started and those purchased from these two funds. This gives the school four books per enrolled student.

The PTA has set a goal which will call for a yearly sum from their organization to equal the grant of the board of education. The book fund comes from PTA dues and proceeds of the annual school carnival.
