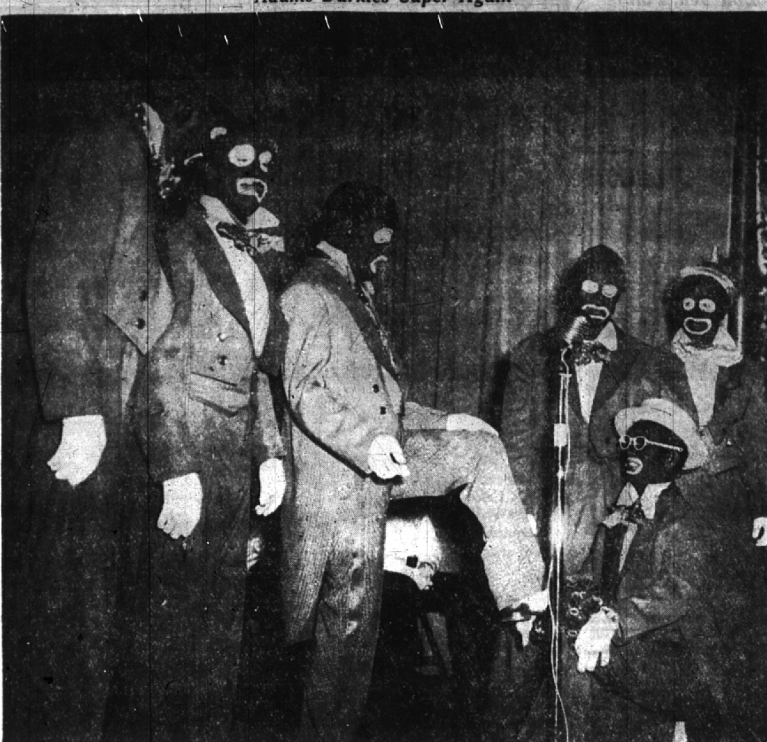

"Unrest and riots in Palestine during the past years resulted from many causes," Mrs. Bayha "said" in a report submitted to the AAUW Wednesday, November 8.

"Jerusalem," she said, "has ever been sacred to Christians, Muslims and Jews. Scores of thousands visit it each year as pilgrims."

"Greater Jerusalem, including Bethlehem, should be made an international trust, where each race feel equally at home and share in a common endeavor."

Mrs. Vester, author of "Our Jerusalem, An American Family in the Holy City," told many incidents of the work of the American Colony of Jerusalem, founded by her father, Horatio Spafford, in 1881.
