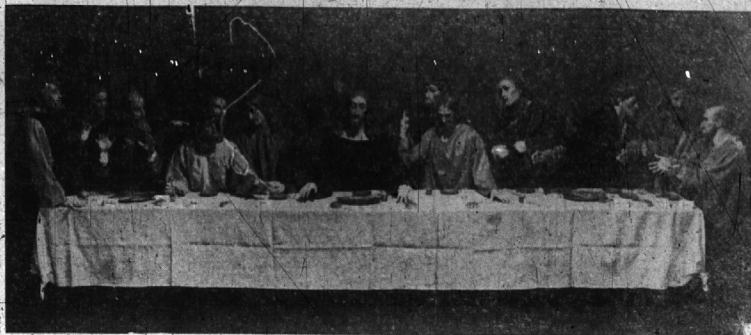

City to Purchase New Police Car

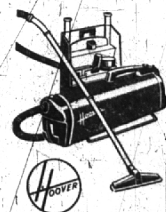
The city commission has approved the purchase of a 1950 Chevrolet sedan for the police force at a cost of \$140 in exchange for a 1948 Chevrolet.

Pembroke Street Improvement Hearing Set for November

A hearing will be held Nov. 20 on the proposed special assessment district for paving in Pembroke Manor.

Streets slated for paving with 20 foot concrete paving are St. Andrews, Maple to Pembroke; Pembroke, Eton to Coolidge; Manchester, Windemere and Buckingham, all from St. Andrews to Coolidge.

Edenborough, Manchester to Pembroke, would have a 33-foot width to tie into existing construction to the south.

Estimated cost of the project is \$108,750 for six-inch concrete pavement with integral curb, including all necessary drainage structures and excavation.
