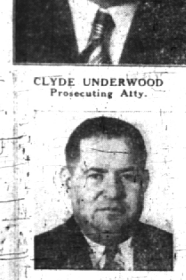

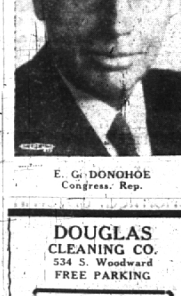

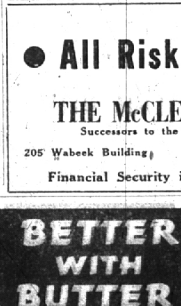

J. J. Meyer, head of the social studies department has charge of the program which begins at 8 o'clock.

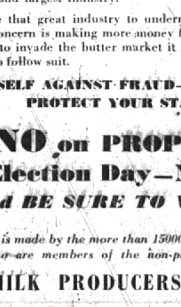
A membership drive and visit to the various classrooms will follow the program.
