FRANKLIN—Fire of undetermined origin completely destroyed a barn on the Dr. Leland Harley property early Sunday evening. The Franklin Southfield, Farmington and West Bloomfield fire departments responded but were unable to extinguish the blaze which had made too much headway before discovery. **Association Objects To Use of Property As Parking Area**  
Objections to the city rezoning property on the west side of Torrey between Sheffield and Torry for use as a parking lot by the Big Bear market were raised by the Sheffield Estates Property Owners association Monday evening at the city commission meeting. A letter from P. E. Glossop, president of the group, stated that the property is now zoned for single family residence only and association opposes the rezoning of the property for any purpose that that specified in subdivision restrictions. The letter pointed out that the association understands that prior covenants as represented by subdivision restrictions would take precedence over a re-zoning by the city. The city plan commission has endorsed the rezoning of the property if it is restricted to parking. The commission agreed that the city should keep out of the situation and turned the matter over to be settled between the association and John Knecht, owner of the property. The commission suggested that Knecht have an architect's sketch of the proposed parking lot prepared and go over it with the association.
