BITS OF BIRMINGHAM

In one of its more serious moments "Salute to Baldwin," the Washington group's parity show staged Nov. 15-17, tribute was paid to some of the persons who have been instrumental in the success of the Birmingham school system and Baldwin high school. In a short history of the school it was pointed out that the school opened some 33 years ago and since that time more than 3,000 students have been graduated from it. An average of nearly 100 per class is really a record, this Wanderer feels.

Some 600 residents of Birmingham and vicinity are being wished a Merry Christmas this week by the Birmingham Federal Savings and Loan association. Walter H. Morland, president of the association, said checks had been mailed to users of the bank's Christmas club program, representing nearly \$40,000 in savings.
