Troy township residents will be able to apply for drivers license renewals and address changes at the Clawson police department after Friday, Nov. 24, according to Norman Barnard, township clerk.

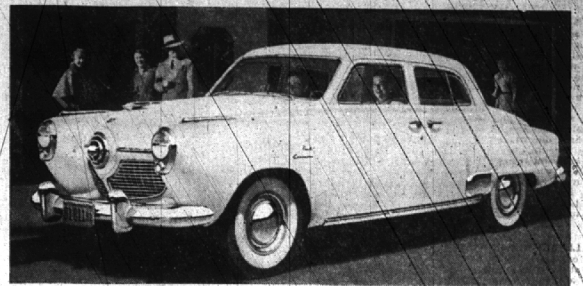
Barnard said that previously all township residents have had to go to the sheriff's department in Pontiac for anything to do with driver's license.
