Council of Churches Opposes Sunday Openings for New Businesses Here

Commercial use of Sunday, as expressed in public openings of new Birmingham stores, was criticized in a resolution approved by the Birmingham Council of Churches at its regular monthly meeting last week.

The resolution reads: "The members of the Birmingham Council of Churches wish to express disapproval of the commercial use of the Sabbath which occurred on Sunday, Sept. 17, when a new super-market was opened in our city for business. "We believe such use of the Sabbath violates the Christian concept of God's day as traditionally held by the Christian people of this community and recognize that such commercial practices be discontinued.

"BIRMINGHAM community holds many intriguing possibilities for those who live here, not the least of which are the quiet and peace of the Sabbath.

"We, likewise, look with disapproval on the fact that at such open house our city was represented by one of its officials and that prominent publicity was given to such representation.

The super-market referred to is Zuckers on S. Woodward, and the city official is Mayor Bruce C. Booth, who took part in the opening ceremonies.

Speaking for the group, the Rev. Arnold E. Kunkel, First Methodist pastor, pointed out: "The intent of the resolution is not to single out individuals or groups. It merely states a principle with which the churches of this community are in accord.

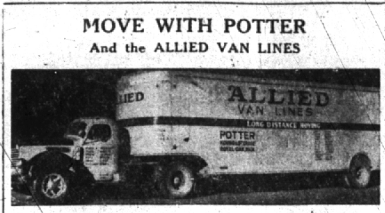
"IT IS NOT our intention to organize a crusade or any such thing. The action of the council was taken in the spirit of Christian brotherhood and cooperation.

He said a copy of the resolution has been sent to the city commission, Packer's, and the Chamber of Commerce.

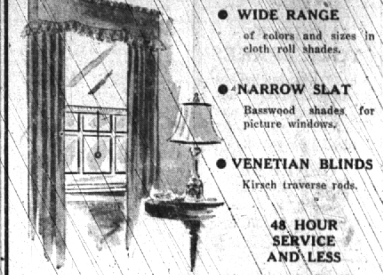
