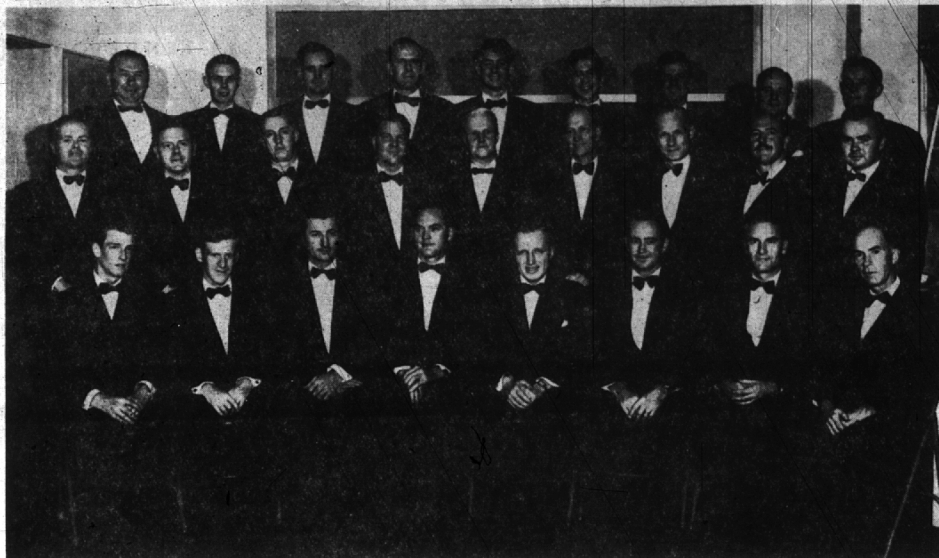


Annual Christmas Concert to Be Presented by the Birmingham Male Chorus
