

# Carrie Lee's Tea Room Scheduled To Open Dec. 6

Carrie Lee's tea room, a new restaurant featuring Chinese and American foods, will open at 855 North Woodward, Wednesday, Dec. 6.

An extensive remodeling job has been done and the inside architecture is in Chinese and Colonial style. There will be an upstairs and downstairs dining room and two small rooms available for private parties.

The restaurant will also be decorated with Chinese antiques. A gift shop will also be operated in the building and it will have Chinese antiques and modern wares.

**CHEFS FROM** San Francisco and New York have been engaged to prepare the Chinese food. There will be separate kitchens for Chinese and American food. Approximately 225 persons can be accommodated in the new restaurant at one time.

A spokesman for the tea room said prices will be moderate and especially will be carry-overs. Definite hours haven't been set yet but it is expected the tea room will stay open until late Friday and Saturday evenings to accommodate the theater crowd and the youth of this area.

Mrs. Carrie Lee, owner of the restaurant, has been a long time resident of Detroit, where she has operated several Chinese restaurants. She is active in Chinese relief work and is a member of the Eastern Star and Order of the White Shrine.

Mrs. Lee is a native of Washington, D.C. and a graduate of Mt. Holyoke college.

## Store, Dwellings Entered In City

Three buildings were entered in Birmingham and reported to the police department on Nov. 25.

At the Bargain Box, 579 East Maple, entry was made by kicking in the rear door of the building, breaking the door casing and fastening bolt. Although the store was thoroughly ransacked and merchandise strewn about the floor, nothing was taken.

In this, as in previous attempts at robbing the premises, the intruder opened a desk in a back room where the cash box is kept.

A. W. Land, 1659 Yosemite, reported to police at 8:08 p.m. that they frightened an intruder from their home as they returned from shopping.

**LAND TOLD OFFICERS** the man had gained entry through a side door which was unlocked and had fled through a bedroom window at the rear of the house.

While investigating the scene, officers discovered the entry of the James Caulfield, Jr., home at 1635 Yosemite. They found the house ransacked and two banks broken open.

Caulfield, who was in Chicago at the time, told officers that after an inventory of his home upon his return, he believed about \$12 in cash, including two silver dollars of recent mint, had been taken.

In both cases, police said, the thief passed up items of jewelry and silver as well as other objects of value, apparently searching only for money.
