

Again Asks City To Pay Rent for Using Eton Dump

Claiming the city has not lived up to a 1946 agreement to be finished with the Eton road city dump by 1948, George M. Dweley, 631 Southfield, this week asked the city to pay him rent equal to the amount of taxes levied on the property.

"This amounts to something less than \$1,000, and I believe only equitable since I have saved the city at least \$1,000 each year in hauling charges," Dweley declared.

He said he bought the property in 1946 only on the assurance of city officials that the dump would be properly filled, graded and finished by 1948.

"I'M NOT OBJECTING in the least to the city's use of the property, because it's done a wonderful job," Dweley explained. "But I object to the fact the city hasn't lived up to its agreement with me. It's costing me money each year I haven't been able to use or sell."

City commissioners said they would decide Dweley's request within the next two weeks after obtaining tax figures from the treasurer and assessor's offices.

Dweley approached the commission on this matter last April, but was asked to come back "after the city budget had been prepared."

"I think perhaps the budget is out of the way now, so the city can act finally," Dweley suggested.
