Local members of the League of Women Voters will attend the one-day Legislative Workshop on Children's Services of the League of Women Voters of Michigan, to be held November 10 in East Lansing.

Representatives from the Birmingham League will be Mrs. T. Hollister Mabley, chairman of the children's services committee; Mrs. Edwin Clarke, Mrs. William Kennedy, Mrs. Paul Leslie, Mrs. Paul Bowers, Mrs. Vernon Matheson, Mrs. A. D. McVay and Mrs. Charles B. Tolle.

FEATURED SPEAKER will be Judge Paul W. Alexander of the Court of Common Pleas division of domestic relations and juvenile court of Lucas County, Toledo. He will discuss the need for organized family and juvenile courts so that matters of divorce, dependency and juvenile delinquency may be dealt with by a just continuance in family counseling and by a court staff specializing in these problems.

A GRADUATE of Denison university and Harvard, Judge Alexander is a nationally known writer and speaker in this field. He is chairman of the American Bar association special committee on association special committee on family courts.

In addition, the Workshop will deal with the local conditions reported by local Leagues and discussion of state-wide problems of providing adequate mental health facilities for children, improving state detention institutions for delinquent children, improved case-work facilities through reorganization of county welfare departments and improved foster home care.
