Bible Institute Meets This Month At Baptist Church

The fourth annual Bible Institute started at First Baptist Church last week. Theme for this is "The Bible Speaks To You." Sessions of the Institute are held every Wednesday during November.

Subjects for the series of presentations are "The Bible Speaks To Human Heart, or Light on the Inner Life; The Bible Speaks to Men and Nations, or Divine Laws for Human Order; The Bible Speaks to Parents and Youth, or Scripture Truth on Happy Home; and The Bible Speaks to All the World, or God's Edge in the Earth.

Each program begins with a church family supper at 6:45 to which parents are encouraged to bring their children. After a brief untitled devotional service the institute divides into interest groups.

Adults have an hour of practical Bible study 7:45-8:45 p.m. under the guidance of the pastor, the Rev. Emil Knorr. The children have a story and handwork hour, 8:45-9:45 p.m. under the guidance of the church school. Little tots are cared for in the church nursery.

An extensive Bible exhibit is on display throughout the month. It includes a large collection of Bibles in many languages; and old Bibles, large and small, some as old as 150 years. Members and friends of the church have brought in a large assortment of Bibles in being formed into an interesting experience. There is also a wide variety of books about the Bible for children, young people and adults. Bible dictionaries, helps and commentaries are also exhibited.

Through the courtesy of the American Bible Society there is displayed posters, charts and sample items showing the worldwide distribution, translation and teaching program which brings the Bible to people in over 1000 languages.

The institute is open to the public and there is no registration fee. The only requirement is that attendants call the church to make supper reservations for themselves and their families. Each program includes special music. The aim of the institute, according to the pastor of the church, is to give people a fresh appreciation of the rich resources of truth in the Bible, and to give people practical help in using it for personal inspiration and guidance.

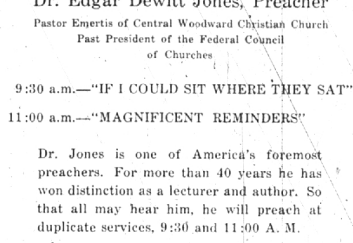

Already 25 ten-year and prospective teachers are enrolled in the course which is open to all. It meets at the church Mondays at 7:30 p.m.

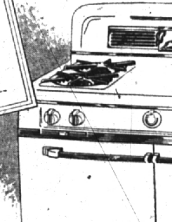
