

### City Buys Pipe For Water Mains

A \$1,953.45 bid from the American Cast Iron Pipe Co. has been accepted by the city commission for 240 lineal feet of 16-inch mechanical joint pipe to connect the proposed elevated water tank to the 12 inch main on Derby road.

The bid was the lowest of three received. The commission also approved connection of the Greenfield road water main to the Derby road main to provide more adequate water supply for the Greenfield race area. City Manager Donald C. Eberhart recommended the connection be made at the time of the installation of mains on Pembroke road.
