## Baldwin to Face Undefeated East Detroit Eleven

Rated sixth in the state and boasting the best defensive unit in the Eastern Michigan league, undefeated East Detroit invades Birmingham Friday night, with the distinction of a goal line crossed only once in five games and a total of 112 points against Van Dyke, Eastern, Port Huron, Van Dyke, Hazel Park, and Bonenville.

Led by Dale Nicholas, considered by many to be the league's most elusive ball carrier, East Detroit's all senior backfield is given more than satisfactory support by an equally seasoned forward wall.

The line includes standouts Captain Clarence Jacobak, center, and Joe Macenti, a 210-pound tackle slated for all-state honors.

Coach Vincent Secontine said "East Detroit is without a doubt the best team in our league. This is one game in which the odds favor our winning are about a thousand to one. We have about as much chance of winning as New Mexico has of beating Army when they play this fall. The East Detroit followers should enjoy this game."

## Portrait Medallion Unveiled to Honor Cranbrook Founders

At a brief ceremony held Thursday afternoon, a memorial to Mr. and Mrs. George Gough Booth, founders of Cranbrook, was unveiled on the terrace of the Cranbrook Institute of Science.

The dedicatory address was given by Charles Edwin S. George, trustee of the Institute, who was introduced by L. James Bulky, chairman of the board of trustees. Miss Martha Booth, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Scripps Booth and youngest daughter of the founders, unveiled the memorial.

The memorial, for which funds were obtained by the donations of several friends, is in the form of a portrait plaque in gilt bronze, by Marshall Fredericks, and inscribed, "Cranbrook, Fruit of their Vision and Generosity."

## Designers to Hear Local Man Speak

Leading industrial designers from all parts of the United States will meet at Princeton, N.J., October 20-22, in a national conference sponsored by the Society of Industrial Designers. Theme of the conference will be "How Industrial Design Can Serve in the National Emergency."

Carl Reynolds, Jr., 784 Shepard Bush, will report on "The Products of Mass Production in the Home."

"Few people realize," say Reynolds, "how much the center of gravity in industrial design has shifted and westward. Only a few years ago New York was looked upon as the principal source of design."

"Now, however, the industrial Midwest, and Detroit in particular, are forging ahead. As might be guessed, this trend is especially marked where the products of mass production are concerned."
