SINCE 1910, when this school for the isolated mountain folk of Tennessee was founded by Pi Beta Phi, its alumnae and active groups throughout the United States have worked to maintain its threefold program of elementary and high school education, health and medical clinics, and an adult educational training program.

It is still the only school available to the mountain people of this scenic area around Gallatinburg, "the Gateway to Great Smoky Mountain National Park."

UNTIL 1944 Pi Beta Phi has completely supported this growing educational project, which started as a one room school with one teacher, and now has 500 students, and many buildings and teachers, also supporting the health center and craftshop.

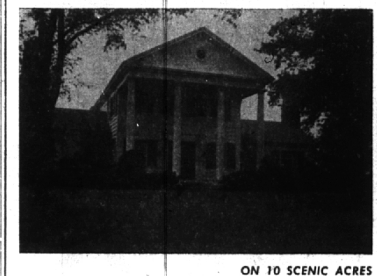
