

Vaughan Defeated By Avondale, 19-0

Falling in their fourth attempt to win a game this year, the Bloomfield Hills Barons were defeated by Avondale High school of Avonhurst Heights 19-0 last Friday.

This was the closest game, the Barons have played, and they looked better than they did against Greene Ho. But they still did have the scoring punch necessary to win. The defensive play was by far the best of the season.

BOB MINHNICK intercepted two passes when the Avondale was in scoring position and Johnny MacLennan did the same. The Barons offensive play was constantly halted by fumbles. In the first half, they didn't complete one series of downs without fumbling the ball.

In the second stanza, Minhnick intercepted a pass on his own 15. A penalty put the ball on the one yard line, where Robin Morton punted out of trouble to the 40. But Avondale drove to the Hills' four in five plays. Halfback Sergeant then drove over the goal line for the first tally.

The Barons' most costly fumble came in the same quarter when Avondale recovered on the Bloomfield 50. A pass from Walters to Sergeant on the five set up the score. Walters then went over for the six points.

The game's finest defensive play was made by Charlie Koella, dependable Barons center for the past four years. In the third quarter

he stole the ball from the Avondale quarterback.
