### Ruth Shain Class Observes UN's 5th Anniversary

The fifth anniversary of the United Nations charter was observed here Tuesday at the fall opening of the Ruth Shain International Relations class at the Community House.

Mrs. Anne Garrison reviewed the work of the past five years to acquaint Birmingham's residents with the aims and objectives of the Dunbar Oaks meeting, laying the ground work of the United Nations San Francisco conference.

"We have watched the growth of the United Nations," she said, "beginning at the point where it took all of its strength to stay alive. We saw it gradually increase its stature until now, by its positive action in Korea, the United Nations has given the world a new lease on peace."

IN INTRODUCING the guest speaker, Lela Bachman, Mrs. Garrison told of her educational efforts in Detroit and her duties as an official observer for the Women Lawyers of Detroit at the general assembly and security council in San Francisco and New York.

Mrs. Bachman spoke of the personalities she met at Flaming Meadows and Lake Success. She discussed some of the experiences and difficulties of starting an organization so vast and diverse.

"Starting from an organization that had no concept of procedure," Mrs. Bachman said, "the United Nations had to vote on the amendment to vote on first!"
