

World Friendship Service To Open Girl Scout Week

Sunday, October 29, will open the seven-day celebration of Girl Scout Week. Birmingham's Girl Scouts and Brownies have chosen to join the nation-wide occasion to honor the memory of Juliette Gordon Low, founder of Girl Scouting, by participating in a world friendship service at the Community House at 4 p.m., October 29.

Miss Martha Sharples, a Curved Bar Scout—winner of Girl Scouting's highest award—will be mistress of ceremonies. The age ceremony will be presented by Intermediate Scouts of troop 2 at Barnum school.

BROWNIES will be represented on the program by Miss Rebecca Wagner, who will carry the Brownie flag, and Miss Becky Winters, who will give the Brownie Promise. Miss Joy Fortune will offer the prayer, "A Hymn of Scouting," and other Scout songs will be sung by the entire audience, led by Miss Polly Hanson.

Mr. Cassius L. Miller, president of the Birmingham Girl Scout Council, will tell the story of Juliette Gordon Low and of how all Girl Scouts, one and a half million strong in the United States, make contributions to the Juliette Low Fund for use in intermediate Scouts of troop 2 at Barnum school.

THE STORY of what Girl Scouting means in the different countries abroad, will be told by five girls from those countries who are students at Marygrove college this year. They will appear in their native costumes and add a colorful accent to the service.

Mrs. Alfred E. Grann of Birmingham, who is the national representative of the United States for the Save the Children Federation, will describe the girls in this country to whom delivered schoolmates bags, made by Birmingham Girl Scouts during the past year. The troops making these bags and filling them will receive from Mrs. Grann a first-class account of how these schoolmates were delivered.
