FIFTH AND SIXTH GRADE:

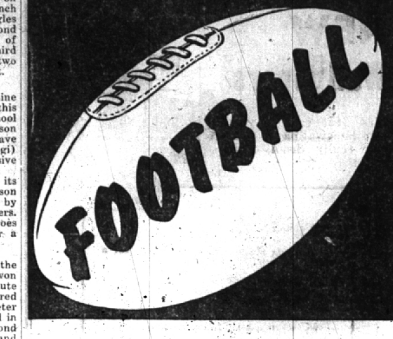
