Alger and Vandenburg Win Locally

City Sets Voting Record; Other Areas Report Good Turnout

A new fall primary voting record was set in Birmingham when a total of 2,817 electors went to the polls Tuesday and favored Fred M. Alger's nomination by almost 2 to 1 majority over the successful Republican nominee, ex-governor Harry Kelly.

Alger piled up 1,504 votes here, compared to 709 for Kelly. Keyes came in a poor third with 188.

BIRMINGHAM AND Southfield township were the only two areas which out-Hendersoned Vanderberg for the Lt. Governor's spot in the GOP race.

ORRIN McQUAID, incumbent register of deeds, took a commanding lead over his two rivals, Herbert Baynes and Omar McTutty.

Tuesday's voting in most local areas was heavier than in previous fall primary elections. In 1948, only 1,885 persons voted.
