Philadelphia La Scala To Open 8th Detroit Festival

The revival of interest in grand opera throughout Michigan this season has reached Birmingham. Opera enthusiasts here are making plans to attend the eighth annual festival of the Philadelphia La Scala Opera Company, October 2 through 8, in the Masonic auditorium, Detroit.

Supplementing La Scala's own cast will be 14 stars from the Metropolitan Opera Company. There will be four "name" conductors and the Thomas Cannon Ballet, all-American dance group. Milton Cross, announcer and commentator for the Metropolitan broadcasts from New York, will come to Detroit for his second season of operatic comment, for all eight performances.

THE OPERAS to be presented are: "La Boheme", October 2; "Lucia di Lammermoor", October 3; "Carmen", October 4; "La Traviata", October 5; "The Barber of Seville", October 6; "Faust", October 7 (matinee); "Aida", October 7 (evening); and "Cavalleria" and "Pagliacci", October 8.
