Bloomfield Hills Drops 39-0 Game To Waterford

Last Friday afternoon at Vaughan School, the Bloomfield Hills Barons were severely trounced 39-0 at the hands of a superior Waterford Township high school team.

The other tallies came on a recovered fumble on the Baron 14 yard marker, and a punt rambled to the Bloomfield 20 yard line which set up the score.

THE BEST GROUND gained for the Barons was Arlon Perry, who was converted from tackle to fullback in the middle of the game. Several times, quarterback Ken Reeves went back to throw a pass, but because of shoddy protection, was repeatedly caught behind the line of scrimmage.

WATERFORD SCORED its first tally early in the first quarter when the left end, Farmer, threw a 25 yard pass from left halfback Kunzer. The other two touchdowns were scored on a sustained drive of 43 yards, and a 44 yard run by halfback Kunzer.

The game with Waterford was originally scheduled to be played away, but because Waterford's new field was not completed, it was transferred to Vaughan Friday.

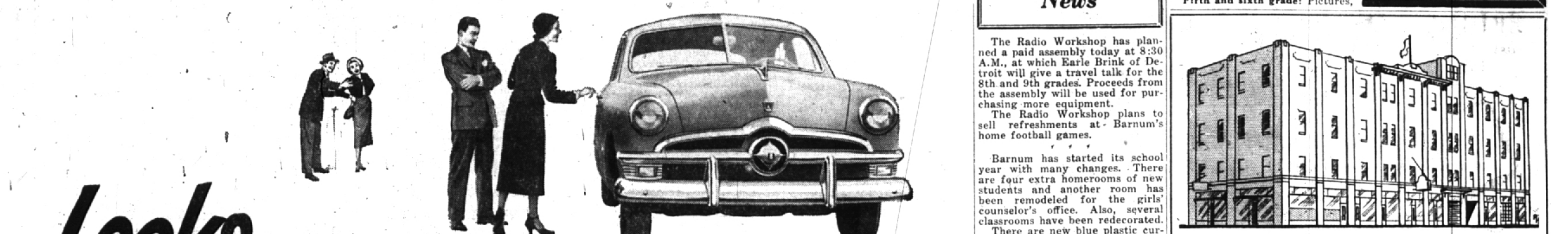

Baldwin Harriers Ready for Season

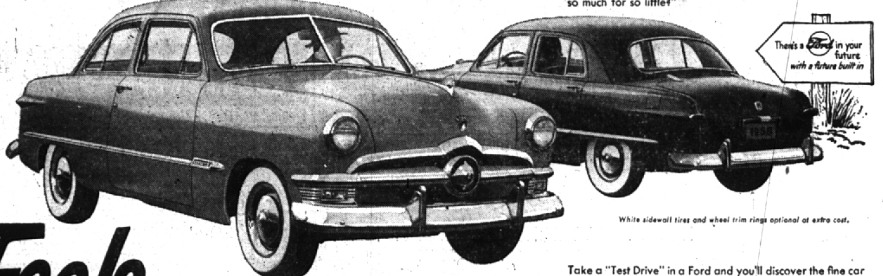
The 1950 Birmingham cross country team, with only three returning lettermen, will be aiming for its third straight Eastern Michigan League championship this season.

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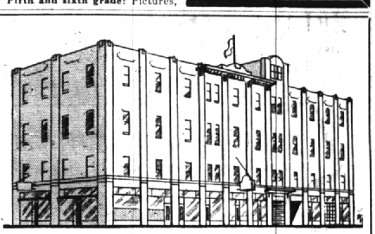
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Student Congress Committees Named
