The first meeting of the executive board of the Walnut Lake PTA will be held tonight at the home of Mr. and Mrs. William Sloat at 8.

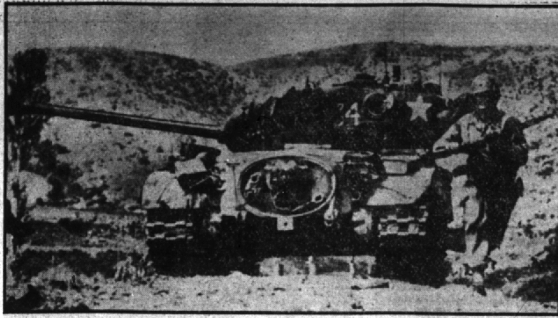
## Weekend Activities
