The bid of Halsey, Stuart and Co. was accepted by the city commission Monday for the purchase of the \$250,000 water supply system revenue bonds. The bonds will finance the new Derby road water tank and other arterial water main improvements.

The firm's low bid will result in a net interest cost of \$104,592.56, or a net rate of 2.2325%.

City Manager Donald C. Egbert has been instructed by the city commission to prepare plans and estimates for pavement on Columbia from Maple to Villa; Yosemite from Columbia to Eton; and Villa from Columbia to Eton.

Egbert pointed out that something should be done about these streets because there will be a large volume of traffic due to the new terraces in that area.

mented by Detroit water before 1955.

The report pointed out that net water department revenues are satisfactory to meet needs of the revised expansion. Financing may be done partially by revenue bonds and partially by general obligation bonds, he said.

Problems of the sewerage system and sewage disposal plant, so closely related, must be considered as one, the manager said. The present sewerage system is the result of the construction of many subdivisions and city sewers, designed to serve particular areas, and in many cases, bear little relationship to the natural drainage area of which they were a part, he said.

The sewage treatment plant, constructed in 1938, was designed for a population of 15,000. For a great portion of the year it is operating at a 50% overload. However, even with the overload, the plant is securing 85% to 90% removal of solids.

The following recommendations were made for studies in connection with the sewerage system and disposal plant:

- (1) Continue efforts to provide adequate county drains emptying into the Red Run drain.
- (2) Devote a substantially greater amount of available time to finding a solution to the problem involved in the Bloomfield drains.
- (3) Continue the efforts of the engineering department toward finding solutions to the problems within the corporate limits.
- (4) Attempt to reach an agreement with the state health department regarding the design factors to be used in treatment of sewage and the volumes which are to be diverted for such treatment.
- (5) Collect sufficient data upon which to base the decision as to the advisability of abandoning the present pumping plants on the east side of the city and permit the sewage from this area to be treated in a larger plant operated by the municipalities of this area jointly.
- (6) Make a determination as to the advisability of enlarging the present plant.

RECOMMENDATIONS WERE also made for streets, recreation facilities, garbage disposal, trees, DPW garage and general operation.

Upon examining both reports submitted by Egbert, city commissioners were unanimous in com-

menting him on the excellence of their preparation.

Commissioner Frank Rising pointed out that while it would cost money, the reports should be printed and made available to residents.

Possibility of this action will be investigated by Egbert.
