CITY OF BIRMINGHAM, MICHIGAN
AMENDMENT TO ZONING ORDINANCE
Notice is hereby given that a public hearing will be held Monday, April 16, 1951, at 8:00 o'clock p.m. in the City of Birmingham for the purpose of considering an amendment to Ordinance No. 114, being an amendment to Ordinance No. 211, known as the Zoning Ordinance, to amend the same in the following respects: unless amended or revised at the public hearing.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND
ORDINANCE NO. 211 OF THE CITY OF BIRMINGHAM BEING AN AMENDMENT TO ZONING ORDINANCE BY AMENDING SECTION 194 THEREOF TO READ AS FOLLOWS:

Section 208B. In that portion of the City covered by provisions of Articles 2, and 31 of Ordinance No. 211, as amended, being those areas which are, or may hereinafter be, zoned as Business A, or Business B, there shall be provided for each 100 square feet of lot area, suitable off-street parking spaces in accordance with the provisions of this section.

(a) If property within any Business A or Business B district shall be used for any of the uses covered by Sections 190 and 202 of Ordinance No. 211 of the City of Birmingham, there shall be provided for any such buildings of such parking facilities sufficient to meet the requirements of said Sections 190 and 202.

(b) If any building other than those covered by provisions of Sections 200 and 202 of said Ordinance No. 211, shall be constructed, altered, or enlarged on any lands within any Business A or Business B district, there shall be provided for said building or buildings, either on same premises, or on a parcel of land within 200 feet, as hereinafter measured at their nearest point, suitable and adequate facilities for the off-street parking of motor vehicles in the proportions set forth in the following table:

(Two alternate tables were submitted, dated 4/11/51, and 4/12/51.)

DWELLINGS OF ALL CLASSES—One space for each family unit plus one space for each two rooms.

APARTMENT HOTELS—One space for each 100 square feet of floor area.

RESTAURANTS, POOL ROOMS, RESTAURANTS, FOOD CONVERSION, OFFICES—One parking space for each 100 square feet of floor area.

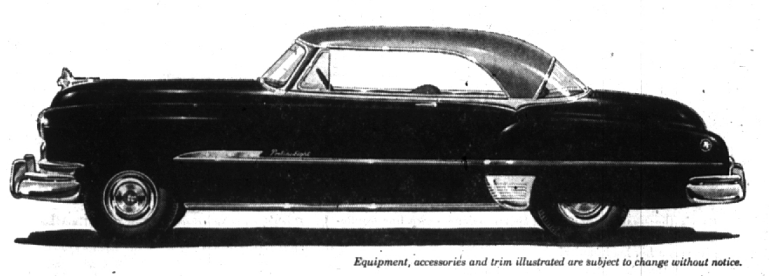
