Kalamazoo Head At Local Church

More than 7,000 churches in the country will prepare special services and programs Apr. 15 for the observance of Baptist Education Sunday. The Birmingham church will be host to Dr. John Scott Everton of Kalamazoo college at its morning service.

Dr. Everton, who will deliver the sermon, has been an educator, administrator and minister and is one of the youngest college presidents in the country. He attended Cambridge university in England on a special fellowship after being graduated from the University of Redlands and the Colgate-Rochester divinity school and has a doctor of philosophy degree from Yale. In 1949 he received an honorary doctor of divinity degree from Grinnell college.

His PASTORATES have been in New York, Connecticut, Pennsylvania and Iowa. He served as professor of philosophy at Grinnell university in Iowa, as well as dean of the chapel. He has also worked with the American Friends Service committee in India and with Mrs. Everton, worked with the Friends in Kentucky.

In addition to this he has been with the International work camp in Finland and the International Seminar in New Hampshire.
